

### **World Bank Group - International Development, Poverty**

Absolute poverty refers to a set standard which is consistent over time and between countries. First introduced in 1990, the dollar a day poverty line measured absolute poverty by the standards of the world's poorest countries. The World Bank defined the new international poverty line as \$1.25 a day in 2008 for 2005 (equivalent to \$1.00 a day in 1996 US prices).


